#### **Short Placement at the Beda**

Candidates are selected through an application and interview process at Ministry Division and the successful applicants are granted a full scholarship for the academic, maintenance, and travel costs of the placement.

#### Reflective Practice in an Ecumenical Context

The short study placements take place within the framework of a Level 6 Common Awards module, *Reflective Practice in an Ecumenical Context* in the Reflective Practice and Pastoral Care section of the Common Awards Handbook (Level 6). This gives an indication of the overall nature and scope of the module, and of the form of assessment. A level 5 module would need to be adapted from an independent learning study module.

# **Shape and Content of the Placement**

- 1. The 2012-13 draft **Induction Programme** (2 weeks in length) is outlined below: that for 2014-15 would be very similar, although starting on **26 September 2014** (being there for this start date would be vital). A draft copy of 2013-14 Autumn Semester Timetable I is attached. The comparable timetable for 2014-15 will be very similar. Candidates will be able to participate in courses up to the half-term point -13 November 2014.
- 2. Candidates will take the 2 core courses: **Pastoral Theology** and **Human Development** with Year 1: this will enable a candidate to be grounded in and with the intake group sharing in the Induction Programme.
- 3. Candidates will then take other courses from the College timetable as appropriate and negotiated with the college. Some written work would be required, such as one written essay, linked to one of the courses, or a seminar paper presented to the group.
- 4. A personal tutor will be provided at the Beda to give support and supervision, meeting on a weekly basis.
- 5. Engagement with the learning/formation programme will be comparable to any other member of the intake group.
- 6. Living accommodation will be provided along with the rest of the students: a single room (with wash basin and ample but basic furnishings) and shared shower/wc facilities on each corridor, plus internet access.

# Assessment for the short placement

Candidates undertaking this placement will be entered for a Common Awards module (as above) and will be auditing modules as agreed at the Ecumenical Institute.

# Formative Assessment

- Regular supervision discussions will provide direction for students on placement
- Auditing modules as agreed with the ecumenical training institution and submission of practical and written work as required.
